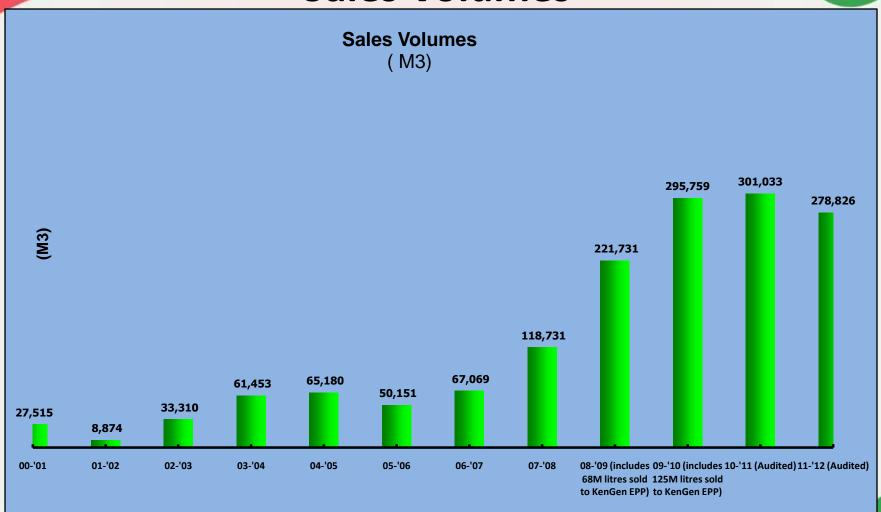

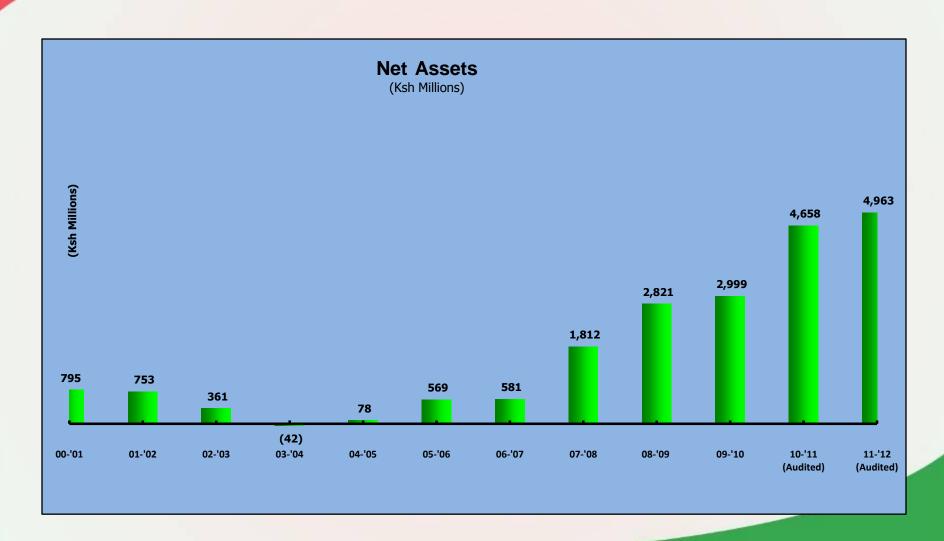

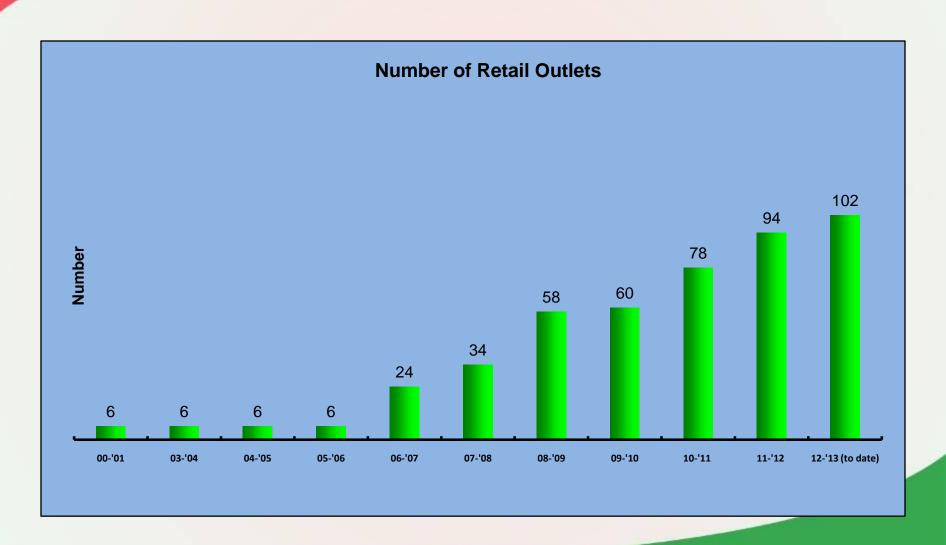

November 2012: Twiga-1 Discovery February 2013: Commercial flow of oil in Twiga-1 well; 2,812 BoPD

February 2013: Hydrocarbon shows in Paipai-1 well April 2013: First flow test in Ngamia-1 well; 281 BoPD additional tests ongoing

- Robust institutional framework: to enhance good governance in oil and gas industry both
 in the public and private sectors,
- Developing local enterprises: to enhance opportunities for local small and medium sized enterprises (SMEs) as well as enable Kenyans to achieve leadership in business and industry by developing greater competitive strength...... Local content
- Developing infrastructure: develop world-class petroleum infrastructure through publicprivate partnerships.
- Caring for the environment: to ensure the proper conservation of the environment and cultural heritage in line with the highest international practices.



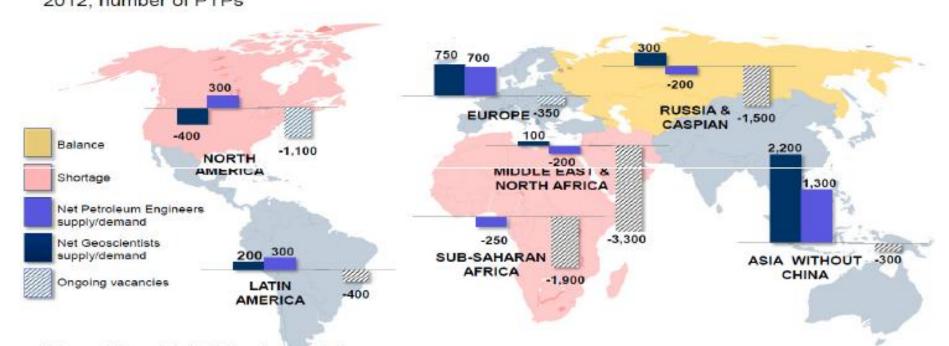

Note: China excluded. Oilfield services excluded

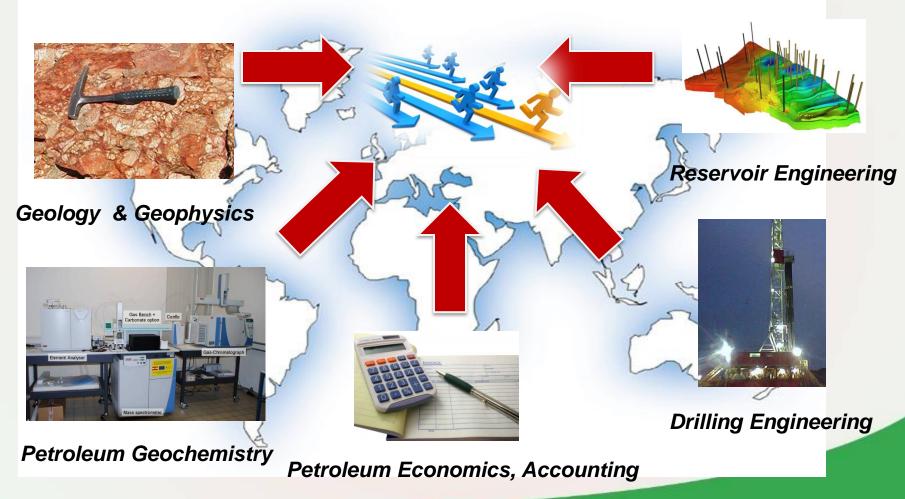
% of 2012 overall demand determined by share of 2011 world oil & natural gas production (from 2012 BP statistical review) multiplied by PTP

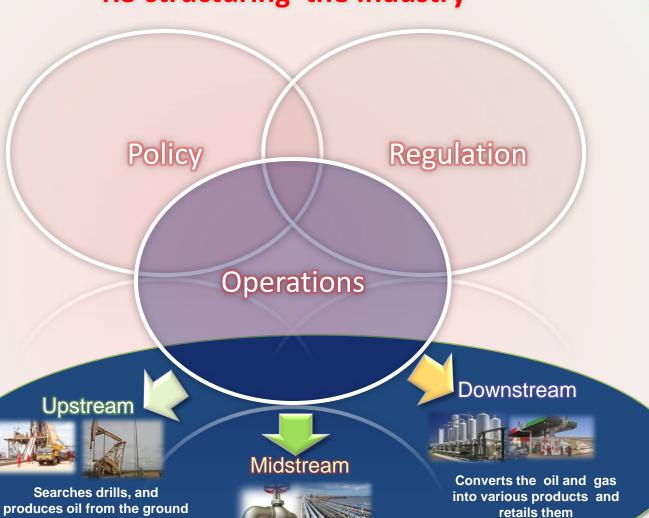

Petroleum Distribution Infrastructure Masterplan

- Mapping out national petroleum infrastructure requirements to year 2030
- Kenya; the Gateway to East Africa -Identifying and integrating regional needs e.g. cross-regional pipelines with Kenya as a termination hub
- National Strategic Reserves

Production Infrastructure

- Most exploration activities being undertaken in very remote areas
- Upon commerciality taking the oil to the market

The Infrastructure Boom

Addressing current challenges at the point of entry

- Development of a petroleum offshore jetty and tankfarm currently underway
- Upgrade of Mombasa Nairobi pipeline to speed up evacuation

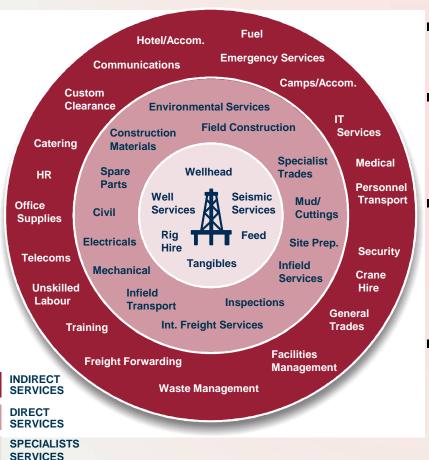

 Infrastructure maintenance, etc
- 2. Oil & Gas Contractors/Suppliers bases (Mainly dedicated for Local Demand)
- 3. Regional Oil & Gas Maintenance & Service Hub ("Free Trade Zone")
- 4. Fabrication/Construction Yards
- 5. Shipyard/Dry-Docking Facilities / Facility to service offshore marine vessels

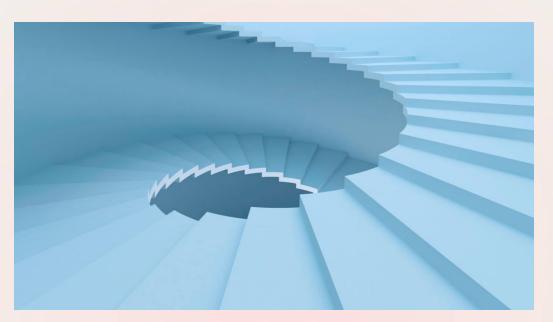
Objective

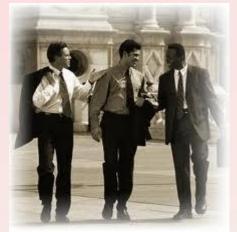

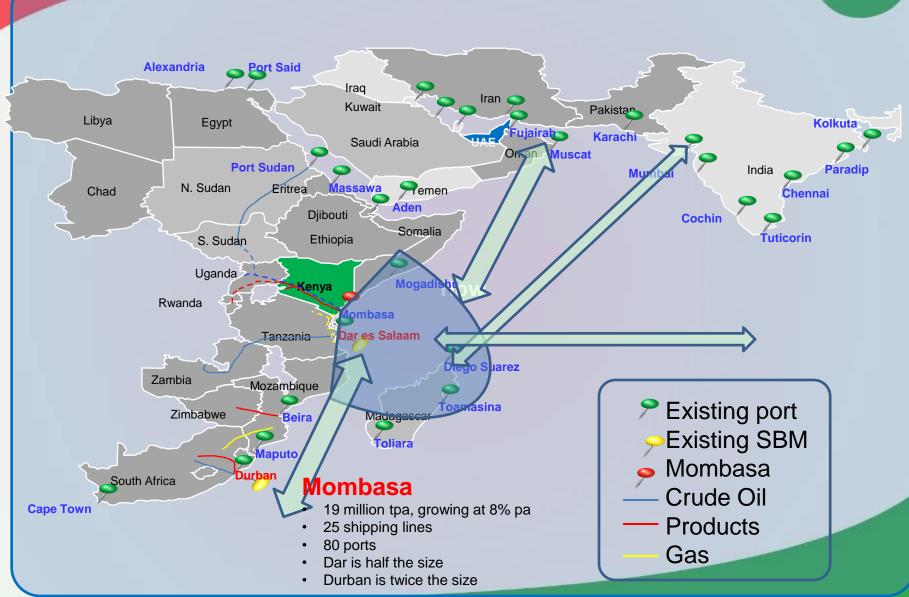
